- Ben Williams was voted by his peers as Above and Beyond Award- 2018 Outstanding Employee

3) **Call to review and vote to approve minutes-** approved

4) **Public and oral communications** (non-agenda) -none

5) **Community Services department Updates-** report by- John Edelbrock presented on number of current employees, operating hours and blend of enforcement services.

**Financial Report-** included strong revenue and revenue growth from meters and citations. For example: 2014 revenue was \$1.241 M/2018 \$1.590 M. Trending anticipates a 1.730 M revenue for 2019.

6) **Public Works department Update -Joe Bride**

1) Two motorcycle, scooter parking added on 15<sup>th</sup> across from the library.

- 2) 11<sup>th</sup> St resident voiced concern regarding parked cars blocking public pedestrian path. **Plan:** Committee member will personally view the area and residents within 500 ft will be notified of TPAC review.
- 3) **Speed Survey- Ryan Zellers and Jake Swim-** handout proved to committee members including roadway, street segments, 85<sup>th</sup> percentile, posted speed limits, measured speed and current expiration date.
  
- 7) **Historic U-Turn restrictions/options/geometry on southbound Camino del Mar, in the vicinity of the 2800 block, Beach Colony Apartments, eliminate north bulb-out, meandering path of travel- Joe Bride**  
Cost estimates will be done and residents from the near apartments and condominiums will be invited to the February meeting for their input.
  
- 8) **Stratford Court and 10<sup>th</sup> Street Four Way Stop Sign Analysis- Ryan Zellers**  
Ryan reported the car count, car speed and 5-year accident history evaluation did not warrant an all -way stop.  
**Recommendations- Joe** will have trees trimmed and/or removed and paint curb to improve visibility.
  
- 9) **Sustainability Advisory Board downtown parking recommendations- Ann Feeney** reported that there are 180 parking spots on CDM including all properties, 90 public and 90 private. She stated that there is a 10% emission vehicle parking allowance in town from 9<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> street.  
  
Discussion among committee members. Proposal from Committee: 9 spots or 5% to start and if successful, committee agreed that increasing spots to 10% would be a good idea. **Eric Sandy** stated that he will evaluate the “least used” parking spots and will let us know the charging station usage at the lifeguard station.
  
- 10) **Streetscape Segment 1 Camino del Mar, 9<sup>th</sup> Street to Plaza, striping/parking Plan- Joe Bride**  
Joe provided a handout with improvement schedule. Schedule is as follows: January- March – East side of Camino del Mar starting north end of Del Mar Plaza, heading south to 9<sup>th</sup> street.

February- April- West side of Camino del Mar, starting north end of Del mar Plaza heading south to 9<sup>th</sup> street.

April-May- Camino del Mar medium- north to south

June- Camino del Mar asphalt overlay, stripping and signage.

Recommendation: Committee will walk the street prior to March meeting.

Rideshare drop offs and scooter ,motorcycle and golf cart parking will be assessed after new curbs are completed.
