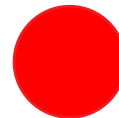

Dear Mayor and Members of the Del Mar City Council,

I have been following the number of new COVID-19 cases in Del Mar every week on the San Diego County website. Here are the numbers from the past several weeks:

Date	Total # cases since December 2020	Increase in # cases in 1 week
December 8, 2021	158	+3
December 15, 2021	160	+2
December 22, 2021	173	+13
December 29, 2021	190	+17
January 5, 2022	324	+134

These numbers illustrate that the state of the City is precarious vis-a-vis the COVID-19 pandemic. The numbers also illustrate why I wrote to you on October 13th, again on December 13th and again on December 20th asking that you require evidence of full vaccination, including a booster, in addition to wearing a mask, as a condition for entry into all public indoor spaces in Del Mar. s

We are now in the middle of the current explosion of cases in Del Mar that might have been avoidable if that policy had been implemented back then. We don't know how long this surge will last but, even though the horse may already be out of the barn at this point, the risk of inaction now is too high to look the other way.

If you attended the recent DMCC holiday party, you know how many vulnerable seniors live in Del Mar; folks who would leave a giant hole in our community if they were taken from us prematurely by an infection they could have avoided from an unvaccinated or unmasked neighbor or visitor at a shop or restaurant in town.

Less visible but no less vulnerable are folks of all ages, including kids, who have asthma, or heart disease, diabetes, cancer, organ transplant recipients, etc, that put them at greater risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death from this surging infection.

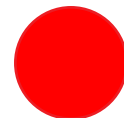
The numbers in the chart above don't lie. This is now an emergency in Del Mar and it needs your urgent attention. Therefore, I respectfully ask all of you one more time, this time publicly, to urgently adopt a policy requiring proof of vaccination and wearing of a mask in public indoor spaces in Del Mar.

Since I assume it's too late to add this to the agenda for your meeting next Monday, January 10th, I urge you to schedule a public ad hoc meeting on this topic for discussion, debate and, hopefully, adoption of a policy that protects Del Mar's vulnerable citizens as soon as possible, ideally next week.
