

**CITY OF DEL MAR GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION
GENERAL INFORMATION
NOVEMBER 6, 2018**

Offices to be Filled by Election

Two (2) City Councilmember positions

Terms of Office to be Filled

The two (2) candidates receiving the highest number of votes will serve 4-year terms that will expire in November 2022.

Qualifications for Filling as Candidate

The candidate must be a resident and registered voter in the City of Del Mar and nominated by no less than 20 registered voters of the City of Del Mar.

Council Structure and Current Officeholders

The City Council is composed of five members of the Council; each elected from the City at large.

The positions of Mayor and Deputy Mayor rotate among the Councilmembers on a yearly basis upon selection by the Councilmembers. Currently, Dwight Worden is Mayor and Dave Druker is Deputy Mayor.

City Council Meetings

The City Council of the City of Del Mar generally meets twice per month, on the first and third Mondays, at 4:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers located at 1050 Camino del Mar. However, near the end of each calendar year, the City Council adopts a Resolution designating the dates and times for regular meetings for the coming calendar year. Council may hold additional adjourned or special meetings as needed.

City Government Structure

Del Mar is a Charter City, operating under the general laws of the State of California with a Council-Manager form of government, which is broadly defined as combining the political/policy leadership of elected officials with the managerial leadership of the City Manager. The City Council appoints two employees: the City Manager and City Attorney. All other employees are appointed by the City Manager.

Salary and Benefits for Office of Member of the City Council
Councilmembers receive \$300 per month.

An auto allowance of \$50 per month is paid to the Mayor, plus reimbursement of expenses for attendance at city-related meetings.

Voter Registration Deadline

Residents of the City of Del Mar have until midnight on October 22, 2018, to register to vote in the November 6, 2018, General Municipal Election.

Precinct Maps

Maps of the City's precincts are available from the County Registrar of Voter's Office.

Mass Mailing

A mass mailing is defined as any identical or nearly identical piece of mail that is sent in any month to the voters in 1% of the population of the jurisdiction from which the official was elected or any mailing that exceeds 50 pieces sent in the 30 days preceding a local election. The only exception is a form letter or other mail sent in response to a letter or an inquiry or an official mailing that is required by law. Government Code Section 84305 pertaining to mass mailing is located in this candidate's information packet. Additionally, Del Mar Municipal Code Section 2.16.050 deals with mass mailing and the identification of source of campaign material. A copy of Del Mar Municipal Code, Chapter 2.16 - Campaign Regulations, is located in this candidate's information packet.

City Council Meeting Agendas

City Council meeting agendas and all associated reports are available for review and/or downloading on the Del Mar City Web Site: <http://www.delmar.ca.us/AgendaCenter>.

Additionally, all interested people can sign up for e-mail notices of City meetings and news by going to the Del Mar City Web Site and filling out the form for Email Newsletters. This is located in the top right corner of the main web page. Candidates can watch Del Mar Council Meetings live on either the Del Mar TV channel or on the City's web site where the meetings are video-streamed live, as well as archived. Furthermore, complete (hardcopy) agenda packets will be provided for each meeting to those candidates so requesting. The agenda packet can be picked up in the City Clerk's Office any time after Noon on Friday prior to the Monday meeting.

Candidate Fees

There is no filing fee. However, if the candidate wishes to file a Candidate Statement of Qualifications, a check payable to the "City of Del Mar" in the amount of \$850.00 must be provided to the City Clerk at the time of filing the Nomination Paper to cover the cost of translating and printing the statement in the ballot pamphlet. If the actual cost of translation and printing is more, the candidate will be billed, if less, the candidate will receive a refund of the excess amount.

Placement on the ballot

The order of names on the ballot is determined by the Secretary of State on August 16, 2018, when he/she holds a random alphabet drawing. For example, if the letter "M" is drawn first, candidates with last names starting with "M" will appear first on the ballot.

Statement of Economic Interests Filings

Each candidate for Member of City Council must file a Statement of Economic Interest (Form 700) disclosing certain investments and interest in real property held at the date of filing the Nomination Paper with the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall make and retain a copy and forward the original to the Fair Political Practices Commission in Sacramento. This Statement of Economic Interests is entirely separate from and does not include campaign finances.

Every person who is elected to office, within 30 days after assuming such office, shall file a statement disclosing his or her investments and his or her interest in real property. Persons leaving office (current officeholders not elected) must also file a Statement of Economic Interests within 30 days after leaving office.

Campaign Disclosure

The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) provides a manual on requirements and methods for reporting contributions and expenditures in connection with an election. The FPPC's Campaign Disclosure Manual 2, Information for Local Candidates, Superior Court Judges, their Controlled Committees, and Primarily Formed Committees for Local Candidates, and FPPC Disclosure Manuals 1, 3, and 5, and Addendum to Manual C are available through the FPPC's website (www.fppc.ca.gov). Additionally, Manual C, E and F are available from the FPPC by calling their request line at 1-866-ASK-FPPC and pressing "1" to order.

BEFORE a candidate solicits or receives any contributions or makes expenditures from his/her personal funds on behalf of his/her candidacy, the original of Form 501 "Candidate Intention Statement" must be filed with the City Clerk.

If you form a committee to collect money in support of your candidacy, you MUST file Form 410 with the Secretary of State when you have spent or received \$1,000. An original Form 410 is provided in this packet. A copy of Form 410 must be filed with the City Clerk's office.

Special attention must be given to Chapter 2.16 of the Del Mar Municipal Code. This section limits campaign contributions and imposes more stringent contribution reporting requirements than the State. You will find Chapter 2.16 enclosed in this Candidates' Information packet. An original Del Mar Statement of Organization form (and one copy) MUST be filed with the City Clerk's office when you have spent or received \$250. An original Del Mar Statement of Organization is provided in this packet.

Election Results

The City of Del Mar General Municipal Election will be consolidated with the Statewide General Election conducted by the San Diego County Registrar of Voters (ROV) and held on November 6, 2018. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Preliminary results will be available on-line on the ROV Home Page beginning shortly after 8:00 p.m. on November 6, 2018, and will be updated periodically as voting precincts are counted.

Between November 6, 2018, and December 6, 2018, the San Diego County Registrar of Voters shall canvass the election. Once the Election results are certified by the Registrar, the City Council will hold a meeting at 1050 Camino del Mar in the Town Hall to confirm the results of the ROV Official Canvass and to administer the oath of office to the newly elected Councilmembers.
