

# Transmission Line (TL) 674A Reconfiguration and TL 666D Removal Project



## Did you know?

This project will reduce environmental impacts to coastal wetlands near and within the San Dieguito Lagoon, Los Penasquitos Lagoon and Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve.

*Our commitment to providing safe and reliable energy means enhancing our system which includes power line replacement and removal activities. This Project will help increase system capacity and reliability while also improving safety and aesthetics in surrounding communities by undergrounding existing lines.*

## Overview

We are installing a new one-mile section of underground transmission line (TL) within Villa de la Valle Road. Upon completion, we'll be removing the existing TL 666D and converting around one mile of existing overhead distribution circuits to underground.

All project components are within SDG&E's existing rights-of-way, property or franchise within San Diego and Del Mar.

## Project benefits

- Increased reliability and capacity of the electric distribution system
- Minimizes environmental impacts by removing the existing power line from within the San Dieguito Lagoon, Los Penasquitos Lagoon and Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve.

## About the project

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) granted SDG&E® a Permit to Construct this project on June 3, 2019.



*This transmission line project will help improve service reliability for families in the surrounding communities.*

The project will improve safety, and enhance reliability and operational flexibility, while minimizing environmental impacts within San Diego and Del Mar.

## What to expect

Throughout the project, we'll work as safely and quickly as possible and make every effort to minimize disruptions such as construction traffic, dust and noise along the affected streets. Although not anticipated, our work may require us to shut off the power for safety purposes. If so, we'll contact you in advance to ensure you're prepared for a planned outage.

Construction activities often occur intermittently and are often not completed concurrently. The use of helicopters and construction equipment may temporarily increase local noise levels, dust and other disturbances.

## Project schedule

Construction work will generally be between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday - Saturday and evening and night work may be required and will be coordinated with the cities of San Diego and Del Mar. *Temporary lane closures and traffic delays are anticipated.*
